ABDUL HAMID EL-AHDAB, a national of Lebanon, is a member of the Paris Bar and Beirut Bar.

Dr. El-Ahdab holds law degrees from the University of Lebanon and a LL.D. from the University of Paris V. As a private practitioner his areas of specialization are Arab law, Islamic law and European law.

Dr. El-Ahdab is President of the Arab Association for International Arbitration, Honorary President of the Lebanese Arbitration Association, Secretary General of the Euro-Arab Association for International Arbitration, Vice-Secretary General of the Union of Arab Arbitration Centres.

Dr. El-Ahdab is a member of several professional Associations among which, the Board of Directors of the Cairo Regional Centre for International Commercial Arbitration, the London Court of International Arbitration (LCIA), the International Bar Association (IBA), the Swiss Arbitration Association (ASA), the International Union of Lawyers, the Association of Lawyers admitted to a Foreign Bar, the Association of Arab and African Arbitrators and the Committee of Conciliation and Arbitration (CCI), Dubai. Further he has acted as presiding, sole arbitrator and counsel in many arbitration disputes and is the author of numerous articles and publications on arbitration.

SAMIHA EL KALIOUBY, a national of Egypt, is Professor of Commercial and Maritime Law, Faculty of Law, Cairo University, and was Deputy Dean of the same Faculty.

Dr. El Kaliouby, member of the Egyptian Shoura Council, holds a Doctorat d'Etat from the University of Toulouse (France), and was a visiting Professor at various Universities in Europe and in the Arab world. She is a member of the Association of International Law, Economics and Legislation and an arbitrator at the Euro-Arab Arbitration Center in Paris. She is the author of numerous publications on commercial law and industrial property.

TEIMA EL SHEMARI, a national of Kuwait, is a Professor of Commercial Law, Faculty of Law, Kuwait University.

Dr. El Shemari, holds law degrees from Kuwait University and Harvard University and a Ph.D. from Duke University. He was Legal Advisor to the Ministry of Commerce and Industry in Kuwait, Assistant-Dean of the Faculty of Law of Kuwait University and owns a Law firm in Kuwait.

Dr. El Shemari, is a member of the Arbitration Institute for Mediterranean and Middle East Countries (Cyprus) and is the author of articles and publications on Commercial Law.

OMAIA ELWAN, a national of Egypt, is a Professor of Comparative Law at Hielderberg Law Institute (Tederal Republic of Germany) and at Cairo University (Egypt).

Mr. Elwan holds law degrees from Cairo University and the University of Rennes, (France), and has a Doctorate from the University of Heidelberg. He lectured in a number of academic institutions and universities in Europe and in the Arab world and is the author of various publications on Comparative, Commercial and Constitutional Law. Dr. Elwan is the Co-President of the Association of Islamic and Arabic Law.

CHRISTOPHER GIBSON, a national of the United States of America, is a Senior Legal Officer at the WIPO Arbitration and Mediation Center, World Intellectual Property Organization, Geneva, Switzerland.

Following graduation from Boalt Hall School of Law, University of California at Berkeley, Mr. Gibson clerked for The Honorable Stanley A. Weigel in the Federal District Court for the Northern District of California. Before joining WIPO in 1997, he practiced with the international law firm of Pillsbury, Madison & Sutro in San Francisco and Silicon Valley, California. He also has worked as a Legal Assistant at the Iran-United States Claims Tribunal in The Hague, The Netherlands, and headed a division of the United Nations Compensation Commission dealing with claims arising from the Gulf War.

Prior to law school, Mr. Gibson received his Bachelors of Arts degree from the University of Chicago and a Masters in Public Policy from the Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University. He has participated in conferences as a speaker, and has authored or contributed to publications on a variety of legal subjects, including arbitration and intellectual property law.

ALASTAIR HIRST, a national of the United Kingdom, is a member of the English Bar and a Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators. Fluent in Arabic, he maintains an independent private practice in the Middle East specializing in business law, including arbitration. He is also visiting lecturer in Business Law at the Sultan Qaboos University in Oman.

Mr. Hirst's early professional work was in collective Intellectual Property Rights administration and arbitration in Europe, the Indian Subcontinent and the Far East. He was also a member of the Group of non-governmental experts on the Legal Protection of Computer Software advising WIPO. He has worked on a number of Gulf regional studies on Intellectual Property Rights topics.

FRANCIS GURRY, a national of Australia, is Director of the WIPO Arbitration and Mediation Center and Legal Counsel of the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO).

Dr. Gurry holds law degrees from the University of Melbourne and a Doctor of Philosophy from the University of Cambridge in the United Kingdom, and is a Fellow of The Chartered Institute of Arbitrators. He is Vice President of the International Federation of Commercial Arbitration Institutions (IFCAI).

Before joining WIPO in 1985, he practiced as an attorney in Melbourne and Sydney and also taught law at the University of Melbourne. At WIPO he has held positions in the Development Cooperation and External Relations Bureau for Asia and the Pacific, the Industrial Property Division, the Office of the Director General and the Office of a Deputy Director General.

He is the author of a textbook on the law of trade secrets and confidential information, entitled *Breach of Confidence*, published by Oxford University Press in the United Kingdom in 1984 and re-printed in 1990.

MOHAMED-HOSSAM LOUTFI, a national of Egypt, is a Professor of Civil Law at Cairo University, Department of Beni Sweif.

Dr. Loutfi, holds law degrees from Cairo University and a Doctorat d' Etat en droit from Paris University XI (Sceaux).

Dr. Loutfi was a District Attorney and currently is Consultant at the Cairo Regional Centre for International Commercial Arbitration, and Consultant at Shalakany Law Office in Cairo. Commercial Law Department of Baghdad University, Assistant Secretary General, at the
Asian African Legal Consultative Committee and Representative of Iraq to the UNCITRAL.
Dr. Sami is currently Dean of the Faculty of Law, Amman National University (Jordan).

JERNEJ SEKOLEC, a national of Slovenia., is Senior Legal Office of the Secretariat of the United Nations Commission on International Trade Law (UNCITRAL).
